Financial Donation Helps Send Baltimore County Pentathlete to London Olympics

BALTIMORE (July 24, 2012) — CFG Community Bank is pleased to announce its financial support of one of Maryland's very own Olympic athletes: Suzanne Stettinius of Baltimore County. The 24-year-old pentathlete will compete in the modern pentathlon in the Summer Games in London, which run from July 27 to August 12.

As avid supporters of local organizations and personalities dedicated to promoting health and fitness, CFG Community Bank made a \$5,000 donation to the U.S. Pentathlon in Stettinius' name in hopes of helping the young athlete compete in the London Olympics. Stettinius spent the months prior to the Olympics trying to raise \$60,000 in sponsorships; CFG's contribution was paramount in helping Stettinius achieve her goal to compete in London this year.

With its roots in a 19th-century legend, the modern pentathlon challenges athletes to complete five very different elements in a single day as they attempt to win gold. In the 2012 London Olympics, the day-long competition starts with fencing in the Copper Box followed by a 200-meter swim in the Aquatics Centre. The athletes then leave the Olympic Park for Greenwich Park, where they will complete a show jumping course on an unfamiliar horse. The day concludes with the combined event, in which competitors complete a three-kilometer run that includes stop-offs at shooting points where they must hit five targets. In this exciting final element, the day's victor is decided as the first to cross the finish line takes the gold medal.

"CFG's generous donation has made it possible to pay for all the coaches who contributed to Suzanne's success and have helped her train for the Modern Pentathlon in the London Games," said William Stettinius, Suzanne's father. "It truly takes a village to send an athlete to the Olympics—from the coaches, to the trainers, to the sponsors—and we want to thank CFG Community Bank for their support."
